Session Aims and Objectives

- Knowing what a pet needs on a daily basis
- Matching the different needs of different pets
- Communicating with animals

Notes and Background Information

Being able to say what they as children need on a daily basis: Rest, somewhere to play, something to eat, something to drink, a hug, to do well

Session and Activity Outline:

Introduction:

Real objects or flashcards of random pictorial representations of what they, as children need on a daily basis, which they can pick out, or hunt for in an area (put in a couple of 'red herrings') Talk about them with a group, how many chose this one etc. what does it mean, how many times do you need.... per day? Main Activity:

Read a simple story of getting a new pet, can the children think of anything that the new pet would need? Bring out real equipment and pictorial representations of the equipment that an animal needs, with a picture of a dog and catmatch the equipment to each animal

Use the matching activity that they can sort on their own

Question

What else do you need to know to help your new pet settle into their new home?

Getting to know their new pet-

Role play- approaching their new pet, and getting to know them

Plenary:

Draw or write or cut and stick a shopping list together that helps prepare for their new pet.

Resources/Materials

Real equipment useful for cats and dogs Picture cards of equipment needed Video or real life representation about approaching animals and getting to know them Oak Tree information about getting a new pet

Extension Exercise/Take Home Activity (if the group is fast to finish, or members of the group are fast to finish) Describe your dream new pet: name, when they are getting it, what would they like to happen when they get their new pet?
