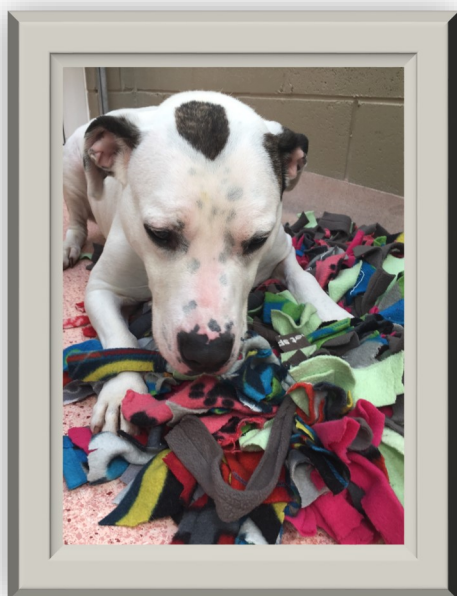


Enrichment Toys

Knot strips of old fleece though a plastic mat and hide dry food in the fabric.



Hide some dry food underneath some tennis balls in an empty egg box carton.

Shop-bought enrichment toys are more expensive than making your own and don't necessarily offer more fun. However they do tend to be more durable and can be better suited to a pet on a wet diet. Kongs and similar toys are widely available online and in Oak Tree's very own retail area at reception.

Children's sandpits and ball pools can provide an excellent place to bury dried treats for your pet to seek out, but be prepared to clean up the mess!



Homemade Whack a Mole for your cat! Simply take a cardboard box, cut some holes in the top. Attach a feather to the end of a stick and poke it through the holes in a random order. Great fun!

This ingenious toy threads a pole through cups that contain dry food. The dog has to nudge the cups to tip the treats out. The pole can be substituted for string.
